

s40 has now completed her review (attached alongside s40 review) and we met to discuss this morning. We feel that the most appropriate route now is for this proposal to be considered via UCL's Impact Acceleration Account funding route. This is advised on the following basis:

- Impact Acceleration Accounts (IAA) are awards made to Research Organisations that are used to help researchers collaborate with communities, businesses, and policy makers. The aims of the Statistics Review are consistent with that purpose.
- Under our IAA model, the decision about which specific activities to fund rests with the individual IAA, with the requirement that they have robust mechanisms in place to help them decide which activities to support. UCL, alongside all other Research Organisations holding an IAA award, provided details about the mechanisms they would use to allocate funding, and their overall approach to governance of the IAA, as part of their original application to ESRC. We would expect this proposal to be considered under those established mechanisms. This means that the ultimate decision as to whether this proposal should be funded would be made by UCL. As with any research activity supported either directly or indirectly by ESRC, the host institution is also responsible for ethics approval.

Following on from your request on the Statistics Review, please see relevant information below. Apologies for the delay – I needed to gather and confirm details with those closer to some of the process.

- UCL submitted a request for funding for this project using ESRC’s strategic form.
- This application was sent for both internal and external expert review. Reviewers were asked to comment on the strength and weaknesses of the proposal, including its scientific merit (please note that as this was not a project that ESRC had commissioned, there wasn’t a set of assessment criteria that the reviewers were asked to provide a numerical score against).
- Following consultation with the s40, it was agreed that the most appropriate route for this proposal was via UCL’s Impact Acceleration Account funding route. This was judged to be the most appropriate funding route on the basis that Impact Acceleration Accounts (IAA) are awards made to Research Organisations that are used to help researchers collaborate with communities, businesses, and policy makers. The aims of the Statistics Review are consistent with that purpose.
- While ESRC is able to provide additional funding to support this project, as with any project funded under the IAA model, funding approval is delegated to individual IAAs. This has been communicated to the s40. IAAs are required to have robust mechanisms in place to help them decide which activities to support under the terms of their IAA award. UCL, alongside all other Research Organisations holding an IAA award, provided details about their decision making mechanisms, and their overall approach to governance of the IAA, as part of their original application to ESRC. UCL have confirmed they are happy to approve the project under their IAA mechanism. As with any research activity supported either directly or indirectly by ESRC, the host institution is also responsible for ethics approval. Funding for this project cannot be provided until research ethics approval is in place.

Thank you for the note and the peer-review feedback. [redacted] (whose team stewards our IAAs) and I have discussed this morning.

As this is a direct award to Professor Sullivan that has undergone ESRC peer review, our normal processes would not involve any further peer review internally or competitive element. The proposal is consistent with the aims of our IAA awards, which are made to Research Organisations and used to help researchers collaborate with communities, businesses, and policy makers. While ESRC can provide an uplift to the IAA to cover the costs of the proposal, as with all IAA funding, final decision making is devolved to the Research Organisation in receipt of the award. UCL should follow the processes set out in their original application to ESRC for an IAA award when processing this proposal. As with any research activity supported either directly or indirectly by ESRC, the host institution is also responsible for ethics approval. Just commenting from a procedural perspective: it is an independent review so it would be very misleading to call it a 'UKRI Call for Evidence' (or an 'ESRC Call for Evidence' for that matter). As you point out, it was funded via UCL's ESRC Impact Acceleration Account – a mechanism where final decision making is devolved to the Research Organisation in receipt of the award. Others may have a view on the extent to which it is helpful to amplify this call for evidence but we should be careful not to misrepresent our relationship to it.

FWIW, I also agree that other platforms such as LinkedIn tend to encourage more positive engagement in this area than X, which can lead to posts being counter-productive.

But [redacted] will likely have views on any promotion activity.

'DSIT [redacted]' have asked for details of UKRI's plans to promote the call for

evidence, which they have described as a 'UKRI Call for evidence'.

I have just met with [s40] from the [s40] team – as they were reviewing the relevant X [account](#) that has been launched to promote the review. She will look to see if there is a suitable factual post that we could share. However, we need to note that past experience of sharing some content on X/Twitter has shown that the account holders subsequently receive negative attention.

Alternative ways of supporting this could include LinkedIn (assuming there is a suitable post to share) and council newsletters, or sharing via colleagues and their investments/contacts – which would mean issuing a request.

As well as choosing the methods and variety of support, we also need a view on whether we see this as a UKRI level activity? Which would mean sharing from UKRI accounts and in multiple available council newsletters. Or whether we see this as primarily applying to ESRC's audiences?

We can advise the DSIT [s40] that this is in fact an IAA funded activity and call for evidence, i.e. funded via a block grant from ESRC, and not a UKRI call for evidence. And that the independent review was commissioned by DSIT, as per this webpage:
