Please could you provide me with information you hold on the "Tackling health inequalities with and for D/deaf BSL-using communities in Wales" which has recently been awarded UKRI funding of £1.04 million to Bangor University.

I would like to access information on the scope of this project and detail pertaining to that. I would also like further information on what panels were involved in this project.

Our response

I can confirm that UK Research and Innovation (UKRI) holds some information relevant to your request. Please see the information below.

Applications were peer reviewed as part of the OPP104: AHRC: Collaborative Community Research to tackle Health Inequalities.

Peer review took place throughout the summer and autumn of 2023, with a moderation panel held on the 28th and 29th November 2023.

The peer review and panel both had lived experience assessors, two lived experience reviewers on each application and a lived experience moderator on each application assessed at panel.
