2) *the response of each organisation (a-f) to the findings of their review.*

The staffing and financial/spending detail within those reviews are not of interest and need not be provided.

Our response

I can confirm that UK Research and Innovation (UKRI) do not hold information relevant to your request. Searches of our records show that neither UKRI nor the Medical Research Council (MRC) hold information within the scope of your request.

MRC does not hold any mid-point reviews within the scope of your request. This is because MRC maintains continuous engagement with these investments and does not undertake formal mid-point reviews. Progress is monitored and discussed through established management structures and agreed monitoring and evaluation mechanisms, which operate on an ongoing basis. Large-scale reviews are conducted at the end of the funding cycle for each investment, with the format varying depending on the nature of the investment.


