Thank you for your Freedom of Information request received on the 11 June in which you requested the following:

Your request:

I am writing to make an open government request for all the information to which I am entitled under the Freedom of Information Act 2000, for the following tender:

- *Notice Identifier: BIP542540939*
- *Awarded by: UK Research & Innovation*
- *Tender Title: GB-Oxford: UKRI-1012 Pulsed X-Ray Generator*

Please could you kindly provide me with the information for this tender:

1. *What are the full names of all those that tendered?*
2. *What is the full name of the organisation, which won the tender?*
3. *I would like a full copy of the tender document from the winner?*
4. *I would like the reasons for selecting this winning tender, compared to other applicants?*

Our response:

I can confirm UK Research and Innovation (UKRI) hold the information relevant to your request. Please find each question responded to in turn below.

1. *What are the full names of all those that tendered?*

This procurement was single source (one supplier).

Therefore, this procurement was not tendered. It was processed via Public Contracts Regulations (PCR) 15 regulation 32, which is a negotiated procedure used to award to a single supplier where it is believed that the supplier is uniquely placed to provide the goods or services required.

Due to the energy range required and the short pulse duration needed for this type of equipment, this supplier was uniquely placed to deliver the requirements, which resulted in the decision for a Single Sourcing Action (SSA) to be used in its purchase.

2. *What is the full name of the organisation, which won the tender?*

Under Section 21, information already reasonably accessible, of the FOIA this information is already available in the public domain:

- The results of this procurement can be found on the governments [Contracts Finder](#)¹ website
- The supplier for this contract can be found on the contract summary for the [Pulsed X-Ray Generator](#)²

Section 21 is an absolute exemption which means that there is no requirement to conduct a public interest test.

3. *I would like a full copy of the tender document from the winner?*

Due to this purchase being an SSA, a tender document was not submitted, therefore this information is not held.

4. *I would like the reasons for selecting this winning tender, compared to other applicants?*

As explained in our response to Q1, this item was purchased from a single supplier due to the energy range required and the short pulse duration needed for this type of equipment. Only one company was deemed to have the ability to deliver all critical performance criteria and technical performance.
