Our response:

I can confirm UK Research and Innovation (UKRI) hold some of the information relevant to your request. Please see the information below.

The assessment period of the August 2020 Smart Grant competition completed on Tuesday 12 January 2021 and the funders panel for this competition is due to be held on Tuesday 2 February, therefore the information being requested for this competition is not yet available. Notifications are then due to be issued on 5 February and feedback released on 12 February. As such, data for the August 2020 Smart Grant competition will not be available until 12 February at the earliest.

Data, as requested, for the January 2020 Smart Grant competition is below.

Please note that:

Stream 1: Projects 18 months or less in duration, with total project cost of £500k or less

Stream 2: Projects either over 18 months in duration and/or £500k project costs
