Thank you for your Freedom of Information request received on the 8 September in which you requested the following:

- 2. Can you provide a list of written public responses by UKRI to open letters to UKRI received in 2020 (the response date does not matter, only if the response was written and public).*
- 3. Can you provide a list of open letters received in 2020 that have not received a public written response from UKRI but which UKRI is aware of and has acknowledged receipt.*

**Our response**

I can confirm UK Research and Innovation (UKRI) hold information relevant to your request.

Please see the information provided at *Annex 1 - Correspondence identified as an open letter*, for a list of correspondence and statements we have identified as 'open letters'.

For the purposes of your request we have applied the commonly accepted definition of an open letter, and therefore have included letters either published openly online, in the press or similar, and correspondence or statements which explicitly state within the text that it is an open letter.

The table identifies open letters received by the CEO's office as well as any other correspondence identified by UKRI as being an open letter.

Additionally, UKRI published two separate open letters on 30 March and 1 June 2020 from the former CEO, Sir Mark Walport, to address concerns that the research and innovation community had raised during the pandemic.
